Although she joined many notable figures, including former Secretaries of State Madeline Albright and Zbigniew Brzizinski, she was unique in her perspective, and her message resonated with both Saudi participants and the U.S. diplomatic community. In recognition of her impact and achievements, the U.S. Consulate in Jeddah invited her for a special reception in recognition of her ability to reflect the human side; the commonalities and interests that the Saudi and American people share beyond the images of political conflicts.


