Internationally millions of people, mostly women, toil in sweatshops to make the clothes Americans wear.

Carmencita (Chie) Abad spent six years as a garment worker on the Pacific island of Saipan in the U.S. Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. She worked 14-hour shifts in dangerous conditions in order to meet arbitrary production quotas. Abad worked for Sako Corporation, which makes clothes for the THE GAP, Ann Taylor, and other major U.S. retailers.

Learn about: working 14 hour shifts per day each week, enduring verbal, pregnancy retaliation, physical and sexual abuse to make the shirts and shoes that end up on retailers' shelves; earning poverty wages, and improving working situations that lead to more repression.
