Our Panel:

Nancy Gallagher is Chair of the Middle East Studies Program and Professor of History at U. C. Santa Barbara. She visited Afghanistan in 2008 and will discuss the role of microfinance organizations in rebuilding the Afghan economy, including why some organizations are more effective than others.

Karon Wright is President and Co-founder of The Greater Contribution, a locally based nonprofit organization which helps women and their families work their way out of poverty using micro loans. Karon received national recognition as a "Vibrant Giver" for her work fighting poverty. She will discuss The Greater Contribution's funding of micro loans, benefiting 10,500 people in the last eleven months in East Africa.

Kailash Narayan is President of India Friends Association (IFA) a non-profit organization based in the Conejo Valley. IFA's project called Society for Rural Improvement has more than 12 years experience using the Grameen micro-credit banking model, and has regularly achieved a repayment rate of close to 100%.
