LOSH Education Coordinator - Good, Green, Safe Jobs

\$45,000 - 60,000/year depending on experience and education (Must be available immediately; includes some evening and weekend activities)

OVERVIEW

The Coordinator will collaborate with existing workforce development organizations such as apprenticeship and pre-apprenticeship programs, public sector and labor workforce development programs, work source centers, and community-based organizations. Funds for the position are available through July 2010 with a possibility of continued employment pending additional funding.

RESPONSIBILITIES - Work with LOSH staff, labor and community partners to:

- Develop and pilot test educational activities, fact sheets, case studies and curricula for good, green, safe jobs.
- Create an interactive online educational tool focused on green buildings and related green jobs.
- Implement education and training programs using a popular education approach and train the trainer model –
 for workers and workforce development staff with the goal of ensuring that green jobs are good, safe jobs

- Working knowledge of worker health and safety and/or green jobs
- Experience developing education programs using creative and interactive materials and activities
- Ability to work independently and with a team
- Experience with labor, community or workforce development organizations

- Spanish language bilingual skills a plus
